Atelier Art (levels 1-7)

Class Description:

The student will participate in a weekly art class which will introduce student to many new concepts and ideas involving art. Atelier Art Level____ is a full year of visual art instruction on 3 DVDs. Students will build and develop a foundation of skills by learning and working through the essential elements and principles of art including: line, color, space, shape, texture, pattern, and balance. This class also includes art-history, media exploration, creative self-expression, and much more.

Learning Activities: Each week the student will be presented with a new lesson from the Atelier Art Program curriculum. The art concepts and project to be completed are introduced by the art teacher on the DVD, sometimes discussed using an art masterpiece. Before the lesson's art project is started, there may be a short "warm-up" which gives the student some experience in using a medium or doing some simple exercises before they start their main project. The lesson's art project is then introduced, discussed, and then viewers get to see it to completion between the art teacher demonstrating parts of it, and then seeing children in a classroom setting working on the project. When the project is finished, viewers will see completed works from other students at that age level, which can be encouraging and inspiring. The student will work on that art assignment for the rest of the week, incorporating the concepts and ideas presented in the art lesson.

Progress Criteria/Methods of Evaluation: Student will be assessed for her participation of art class once a week as well as completion of a weekly art project and/or picture providing documentation that lesson and skill was accomplished.

At the end of the course, student will be required to present and explain each completed project to a small audience.

At the end of the year an art show will be held with the child's work on display.
